American College of Environmental Lawyers (ACOEL) Recognizes Bob Cox with Top National Honor

Bob Cox, Jr., Managing Partner, has been named a Fellow of the American College of Environmental Lawyers (ACOEL). This prestigious honor is reserved for those who have distinguished themselves with "high standards of practice and substantial contributions to the field of environmental law," according to ACOEL.

Mr. Cox is one of 25 new Fellows to be elected by their peers this year for membership in the College as the country's leading environmental attorneys. Since its inception, only 23 environmental lawyers in total have been elected to the College in Massachusetts.

He concentrates his practice on issues surrounding clean air and water legislation, as well as solid and hazardous waste regulations.
